Writing this edition of the newsletter, it is Thursday evening and I am on camp with Mrs Barns, the Year 6,7 and 8 students and a bunch of totally awesome parents. What a cool group of students to take away. So far, they have impressed; the sailing tutors who spent 4 and a half hours with us, the adults who work for Waka Kotane, who taught us how to paddle maori waka toa on the Avon River in Christchurch and the Education Tutor at the Air Force Museum. We have seen Dorie School values on display out in the wider community - these kids are magnificent!

A big thank you must go out to the families who turned out last Friday for the Meet The Teacher/Family Picnic Evening. The teachers really like sharing with you how their classes will operate this year, how you can help at home, their expectations and the chance to answer your questions. I know the kids had a great time swimming in the pool and playing with friends. We hope to have further family events during the course of the year - we will keep you updated as to when these will happen.

Bus Safety - we had a visit from Constable Sean Pattison from the New Zealand Police, earlier this week to remind our bus students about what they should be doing to keep safe on the school bus. He talked about; sitting with your back against the back of the seat, facing the front, talking quietly to the person beside you, having school bags on your lap or on the floor in front of you, keeping the aisle clear, staying in your seat until the bus stops, and wearing your bus vest. At the start of last year all bus students were issued with a free bus vest. Most still have theirs. If your child does not have a bus vest they should come to the office to be issued with another. Over the next few weeks we will be rewarding students who correctly wear their bus vest with house points. It would be really great if parents could reinforce the bus safety points from time to time with your children.

It has been a fantastic start to the year. There is a strong sense of positivity about the school. When moving through the classrooms, I see students totally engaged in what they are doing, cooperating, sharing and caring for each other. What a great school!
